Studying construction at KIT will provide a pathway to become a qualified carpenter or builder. The course has been designed with a focus on the carpentry trade.

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

- Work effectively & sustainably in construction industry
- Plan and organise work
- Conduct workplace communication
- Carry out measurements & calculations
- Read and interpret plans and specifications
- Apply OHS regulations, policies, procedures in construction industry
- Apply basic levelling procedures
- Carry out concreting to simple forms
- Use carpentry tools and equipment
- Erect and dismantle formwork for footings and slabs on ground
- Handle carpentry materials
- Use static machines
- Undertake basic construction projects, including building an Australian house and a *kiakia*

SELECTION PROCESSES FOR KIT FULL TIME COURSES

KIT will review all applications for 2022 full time courses and develop a shortlist of applicants who will be eligible to sit for the required test/s for each course. Where applicable, short listing could include third party reports or references about relevant work experience or school based performance. A personal statement from applicants will be considered for nursing (and other courses only if required).

Testing is carried out as a further way of determining merit and then ranking applicants. Test details are on the application form. Interviews will be conducted for all nursing applicants who have been short listed and meet the required result for the written test. Interviews may also be considered as an additional means of selection for other courses, as approved by the QTLC.

Based on the outcome of the selection process, places will be available to successful applicants. The **names of successful applicants will be displayed** on the KIT Betio and Bikenibeu campuses noticeboard and in other public places from **15 November 2021**.

FEE INFORMATION FOR KIT FULL TIME COURSES (No fee for Nursing)

Enrolment (Filling of Registration form and Fee payment) opens from Monday 9th December 2021 to Friday 10th January 2022 (please note KIT may close from 23rd December 2021 to 1st January 2022). Selected candidates are advised to fill the registration form and pay their fee as soon as possible on that date to secure a place in the course. If a selected candidate does not do these on the dates mentioned, he or she will be replaced by those on the waiting list. If you decide not to start, a full fee refund is available until 17th January 2022. Refunds from 20th January 2022 until the end of second of week of the start of the course will incur a **20% deduction. No refunds will be made for non-starters after the second week of course starts. Fees will be refunded for students who are offered and accept a Ministry sponsored position.**

The following fees will apply for 2022:

- Automotive; Electrotechnology; Construction and Plumbing \$170 per semester.
- Accounting; Business, Community Services and ICT \$150 per semester
- English Certificate I and II \$75 per semester

IF YOU ARE DISSATISFIED WITH A KIT DECISION OR THE SERVICE PROVIDED

You have the right to withdraw your complaint at any time during the process if you so wish.
